KiHS is an innovative and highly respected school that delivers quality secondary programming to First Nations youth on reserve by blending face-to-face mentoring with cutting edge online asynchronous instruction. In this position, you would be assisting in the development and implementation of programs, services and other supports to meet the unique needs of our First Nation students and their families, with a focus on student success and graduation. You would be collaborating with all staff, including the Student Success Lead and Graduation Coach, to improvement in achievement and graduation rates for KiHS students.

## Duties

- Provide expertise, leadership and support to improve student literacy and numeracy achievement, by designing, developing and implementing programs/initiatives/supports at KiHS;
- Work collaborative with staff to collect, organize, interpret and use data;
- Conduct assessments and develop appropriate reports;
- Work collaboratively with the graduation coach to support potential graduates and increase graduation rates. This includes tracking of potential graduates and developing intervention strategies to engage students at risk of not graduating;
- Develop relationships with staff, students, parents and communities, to support student success.

## Qualifications

- Must be a member in good standing with Ontario College of Teachers;
- Teaching and leadership experience in Ontario or First Nations Secondary Schools;
- Have a strong understanding of effective literacy and numeracy strategies, and be able to implement professional development for staff in these areas;
- Experience in implementing culturally responsive pedagogy, including a deep understanding of Indigenous histories, cultures, and perspectives;
- Ability to travel to remote First Nation communities;
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team; and
- Fluency in one of our communities' dialects would be considered an asset.
